### DAY 6—SOWING AND REAPING

**"You can't reap if you don't sow."**

—Gloria Copeland

#### A. Galatians 6:7—A Successful Harvester Sows Seed

1. NKJV: "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap."
2. AMPC: "Do not be deceived and deluded and misled; God will not allow Himself to be sneered at (scorned, disdained, or mocked by mere pretensions or professions, or by His precepts being set aside.) [He inevitably deludes himself who attempts to delude God.] For whatever a man sows, that and that only is what he will reap."
3. It is not "reaping and sowing;" it is "sowing and reaping."
4. In order to reap a harvest, you must sow a seed.
5. Every seed is attached to a harvest if you don't dig it up.

#### B. 2 Corinthians 9:6-8 (AMPC)—He Sows AND Reaps

1. Verse 6: "[Remember] this: he who sows sparingly and grudgingly will also reap sparingly and grudgingly, and he who sows generously [that blessings may come to someone] will also reap generously and with blessings."
2. Verse 7: "Let each one [give] as he has made up his own mind and purposed in his heart, not reluctantly or sorrowfully or under compulsion, for God loves (He takes pleasure in, prizes above other things, and is unwilling to abandon or to do without) a cheerful (joyous, "prompt to do it") giver [whose heart is in his giving]."
3. Verse 8: "And God is able to make all grace (every favor and earthly blessing) come to you in abundance, so that you may always and under all circumstances and whatever the need be self-sufficient [possessing enough to require no aid or support and furnished in abundance for every good work and charitable donation]."
4. When you give in sorrow, there is not faith there, so there is no return.
5. If you sow love, you will reap love. Faith works by love.



### C. Qualities of a Good Sower

- 1. Verse 6—Generous (Proverbs 11:24-25—A liberal giver)
- 2. Verse 7—Spirit-led (JBP—Let everyone give as his heart tells him.)
- 3. Verse 7—Obedient (Isaiah 1:19—Willing and obedient)
- 4. Verse 7—Cheerful (AMPC—Joyous, "prompt to do it" giver)
- 5. Verse 8—Results (AMPC—Furnished in abundance for every good work)

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### DAY 7—MAXIMIZE YOUR HARVEST

**"Your harvest is determined by what you do while you are waiting for it."**

#### A. Luke 6:38—Expect Your Seed to Grow—Miracle-Grow Your Harvest

1. You must sow the seed of the Word in faith, expecting it to grow.
  - a. Live in a continual state of expectation.
  - b. Never give up on your harvest.
2. Talk often about your harvest.
3. "I am expecting a record-breaking harvest."
4. ESV—"Give, and IT WILL be given to you."
5. Psalm 65:11 (NLT): "You crown the year with a bountiful harvest; even the hard pathways overflow with abundance."
6. Declare this: "I expect my harvest every time I sow my seed."

#### B. Psalm 67:5-6—Water Your Seed With Thanksgiving and Praise

1. "Let the people praise thee, O God; let all the people praise thee. Then shall the earth yield her increase; and God, even our own God, shall bless us."
2. Praise and thanksgiving help things move along, since praise and thanksgiving are the language of faith.
3. "The depth of your praise will determine the magnitude of your harvest." —Jerry Savelle
4. "Praise God, my seed always produces a bumper crop."
5. "Thank You, Lord, the hundredfold return is working for me all the time."

#### C. Genesis 2:15—Keep the Weeds Out

1. "And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it."
2. *Keep* (HEB) = To put a hedge of thorns around it, to watch over it; to guard, protect and safeguard





- 3. Weeds include unforgiveness, bitterness, strife—anything to do with walking outside of love.
- 4. You pull up the “weeds” and cast them out with your words.
- 5. “You are going to have to weed your own crop yourself. So get tough about it. When a little weed pops up, kill it! Don’t hang on to it for even a moment. Pull it up by its roots. Spray it with the Word.” —Kenneth Copeland, *From Faith to Faith*

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### DAY 8—WHAT EVERY GOOD HARVESTER MUST KNOW

#### A. John 4:35—A Good Harvester Knows *When* to Reap

1. MSG: "As you look around right now, wouldn't you say that in about four months it will be time to harvest? Well, I'm telling you to open your eyes and take a good look at what's right in front of you. These Samaritan fields are ripe. It's harvest time!"
2. The Holy Spirit will show us when the harvest is ripe.
3. Joy is a major indicator.
  - a. Isaiah 9:3 (TLB): "For Israel will again be great, filled with joy like that of reapers when the harvesttime has come..."
  - b. The closer the harvest, the more excited you become.
4. Exercise patience until the harvest is ready to reap.
5. Ecclesiastes 3:2 (MSG)—A right time to plant and another to reap
6. Keep speaking the Word and watering the Word.

#### B. Genesis 26:12—A Good Harvester Knows *Where* to Reap

1. MSG: "Isaac planted crops in that land and took in a huge harvest. God blessed him. The man got richer and richer by the day until he was very wealthy (This was during a time of famine)."
2. Luke 5:1-11—Peter nearly missed his harvest.
  - a. Peter sowed his boat to Jesus to allow Him to preach.
  - b. Jesus told him to let down the *nets* for his harvest.
  - c. Peter let down his *net*—but reaped nonetheless.
3. The Lord will show you where your harvest is located. Harvest is:
  - a. Opportunities and Favor
  - b. Expansion
  - c. Projects
  - d. New jobs
4. Leviticus 26:9-10 (NKJV): "For I will look on you favorably and make you fruitful, multiply you and confirm My covenant with you. You shall eat the old harvest, and clear out the old because of the new."
  - a. You can live **IN** the harvest and **ON** the harvest.
  - b. This is **THE BLESSING**.



### C. Mark 10:29-30—A Good Harvester Knows to Reap It ALL

1. Verse 30: "But he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time."
2. *Receive* (GK) = To take; to seize, lay hold of, claim and procure
3. Don't leave anything out in the field.
4. Proverbs 27:23: "Be diligent to know the state of thy flocks and look well to thy herds."
  - a. How much did you tithe last year?
  - b. How much did you sow last year?
5. Go reap it ALL!

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### DAY 9—HOW TO REAP YOUR HARVEST

#### A. Mark 4:26-29—Put in the Sickle

1. Verse 29: "But when the fruit is brought forth, immediately he putteth in the sickle, because the harvest is come."
2. A sickle is a sharp instrument for cutting crops during harvest.
3. Our sickle is the Word of God coming out of our mouths.
4. Hebrews 4:12 (NLT): "For the word of God is alive and powerful. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow...."
5. Isaiah 49:2 (NKJV): "He has made my mouth like a sharp sword."
  - a. We release faith with our words.
  - b. The words we speak today dictate tomorrow's harvest.
  - c. When you're speaking, you are sowing.

#### B. Isaiah 41:15—Our Spiritual Thresher

1. NKJV: "Behold, I will make you into a new threshing sledge with sharp teeth; you shall thresh the mountains and beat them small, and make the hills like chaff."
2. *Teeth* (HEB) = Mouths
  - a. Our mouths are the instrument with which we reap our harvest.
3. We reap our harvest the same way we acquire anything else—by faith.
4. Our words of faith cut down the crops and bring in the harvest.
5. Mark 11:24: "Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that you receive them, and you shall have them."
  - a. Take with much force
  - b. Seize with a grip that cannot be shaken off

#### C. Romans 4:17—Command Your Harvest to Come

1. We call those things which be not as though they were.
2. *Call* (GK) = Summons, command to appear
3. Command your harvest to come to you.
4. Send out your harvesting angels.
  - a. Psalm 103:20 (AMPC): "Bless (affectionately, gratefully praise) the Lord, you His angels, you mighty ones who do His commandments, hearkening to the voice of His word."
5. Mark 4:29 (AMPC): "But when the grain is ripe and permits, immediately he sends forth [the reapers] and puts in the sickle, because the harvest stands ready."

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### DAY 10—CRY OF THE HARVEST

**"As soon as you sow your seed, the harvest begins crying out for its rightful owner."**

#### A. James 5:1-4—A Harvest Held Back

1. The harvest that belonged to them, from every seed they sowed, was being held back because of their adversary.
2. The harvest that belongs to us from every seed we have sown is being held back by our adversary.
3. It is time to let out the cry of the harvest.

#### B. James 5:4—The Cry of the Harvest

1. Verse 4: "Behold, the hire [or the harvest] of the laborers who have reaped down your fields, which is of you kept back by fraud, crieth: and the cries of them which have reaped [the harvest] are entered into the ears of the Lord of sabaoth."
2. There are two cries.
  - a. The first cry is from the harvest (or the return) crying out for its rightful owner.
  - b. The second cry is from the people whom the harvest rightfully belongs to.
3. The moment you sow your seed, your harvest is crying out, looking for its rightful owner.
4. The moment you sow your seed, you should be crying out for your harvest.
5. These two cries enter into the ears of the Lord of Hosts, armies and angels.

#### C. Matthew 18:18—Bind the Devil and Loose the Angels

1. Your harvest is crying out for you.
2. But, are you crying out for your harvest?
  - a. Cry does not mean to whine or act pitiful. It is a cry of faith.
  - b. It means to proclaim with vehemence.
  - c. It means to demand immediate action with aggressive force and passion.
3. "Satan, in the Name of Jesus, release my harvest!"
4. "Angels, go gather up it up NOW!"
5. "Do you hear that? It is my harvest crying out for me."

**We need to release our faith and get excited about our harvest!**
