DAY 1 – SELECTIVE HEARING

We must learn to hear the voice of the Lord. Our Father knows everything and is speaking to us—we just need to listen.

STUDY IT

- Jesus said, *My sheep hear my voice* (John 10:27, NKJV).
- The Christian life is simple in principle and in operation. It only requires hearing from God and faith.
- The key to miracles, signs and wonders is: Whatever God says to you, do it!
- Our own words of doubt can prevent us from hearing God's voice. We can be our own problem, preventing our own selves from receiving from Him.
- All we have to do is be open and receptive to God, and make sure we don't contradict His words.
- The Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth. He will not speak of Himself. He will speak to us what He hears. He will glorify Jesus (John 16:13-14).
- We have access by the Holy Spirit to everything God knows (John 16:15).

DAY 2 - EXACT AND PRECISE HEARING

Wisdom is understanding the will of the Lord—exactly and with precision. God is giving you step-by-step specific instructions. His model is that each person is to do his or her part until the Church comes to the fullness of the stature of Jesus.

STUDY IT

- The leading of the Holy Spirit should be clear and real to us every day of our lives.
- The Bible is full of God speaking. He spoke to Moses, Abraham, Adam, Eve, Noah, Jacob, Elijah, David, Solomon, Jonah and many more.
- God promises to instruct us and guide us (Psalm 32:8-9).
- The devil tries to impersonate the leading of God by tempting us through our eyes and feelings.
- Everything that happens is not divine leading. Listen to your spirit—guided by the Holy Spirit—to see what God is doing. Don't be led by external circumstances.
 - Stick led—people think God is leading them through the hard knocks of life, and try to find divine meaning in what is happening in their lives.
 - Spirit led—God speaks to your spirit by His Holy Spirit.

DAY 3 – HEARING BY THE SPIRIT

Christians must hear the voice of the Lord. Make a decision to hear and say, “I believe God’s Word. I believe the words of Jesus.” He will speak to your spirit by His Spirit.

STUDY IT

- The answer to every question we’ll ever face is: Be led by God’s voice!
- Be led by the Holy Spirit—internally, not externally.
 - Don’t be led by needs, by opportunities, by numbers, price or cost.
- If He told us to do something, then the faith to do it came with His command.
- Our part is to walk by faith and walk in love—following God’s voice.
 - God spoke to Elijah, not in a whirlwind, not in an earthquake, not in a fire, not in external influences—but in a still small voice (1 Kings 19:9-13).
- Listen and expect exact, precise and clear communication from the Spirit of God.

DAY 4 – TRUST GOD'S VOICE

Jesus said He is the Good Shepherd. He leads us, He feeds us and protects us. We can hear Him, and He calls us by name. It's up to us to listen for His voice.

STUDY IT

- God has chosen to bless us (Deuteronomy 30:19-20). He is waiting for us to receive what He offers.
- God wants us to give Him at least as much respect as we give a human instructor.
- The Bible is God speaking. He used different writers, but it's still His voice.
- As we get more familiar with God's Word, it will be more difficult to deceive us.
- We should be Word-based and Bible-anchored. If what we hear contradicts God's Word, we reject it (Matthew 4:4).
- Pull out your Bible, go to any page and say, "Lord, speak to me." Start reading, and He will!

DAY 5 - INQUIRE OF GOD AND LISTEN

God wants to be involved in everything we do. He has a plan for us that is exceedingly, abundantly beyond all we can ask or think. He reveals the plan to us by His Spirit.

STUDY IT

- Being led by God is a lifestyle.
- We need a revelation of how big God is and how much He loves us and cares about the details of our lives.
 - The smallest, tiniest details about us are important to God.
 - God is the *Alpha* and the *Omega*. There's nothing bigger than God, and there's nothing smaller than God (Revelation 1:8).
- We don't need a reason *not* to do something—we need a leading to *do* a thing.
- Peter missed out on a great catch of fish, because he didn't hear and obey Jesus (Luke 5:4-9).
- Get direction when you start down a new path, then continue to seek God for every step until it is completed. Every day is a new day in the process.
 - Inquire of the Lord on each step, even if you've done it before.
