DAY I—Prophetic Word for 2019

A. Amos 3:7—Prophetic Word for 2019

1. NLT: "Indeed, the Sovereign Lord never does anything until he reveals his plans to his servants the prophets."
2. 2 Chronicles 20:20 (NKJV): "...Believe in the Lord your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper."
3. Word from the Lord through Kenneth Copeland: "2019—The Year of Abundant Harvest."

B. Deuteronomy 30:9—A Picture of Our Year

1. NLT: "The Lord your God will then make you successful in everything you do. He will give you many children and numerous livestock, and he will cause your fields to produce abundant harvests, for the Lord will again delight in being good to you as he was to your ancestors."
2. *Abundant Harvest* = Overflow, surplus, more than enough, beyond measure, bumper crop
3. *Bumper crop* defined:
 - a. In agriculture, a bumper crop is a crop that has yielded an unusually large and productive harvest.
 - b. A bumper crop can also be a source of problems, such as when there is insufficient storage space for an overlarge crop.
4. "People a lot of times destroy their own harvest by being in strife. Good harvests come with love." —Gloria Copeland
5. There are no limits to the size of our fields or the ability to contain our harvests.

C. Galatians 6:7-9—What Is a Harvest?

1. "Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting. And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."
2. A harvest is the result of something we sow, good or bad.
3. This is the season to sow good seed. This is also the time to believe for crop failures.
4. "You can establish a 'receiving current' all the time when you walk in love." —Gloria Copeland
5. "This year, I will only sow good seed and will reap abundant harvests!"

DAY 2—Overflowing Harvests

A. Psalm 65:11-13—Abundant Harvests Are Overflowing

1. NLT: "You crown [encompass, encircle, surround] the year with a bountiful harvest; even the hard pathways overflow with abundance. The grasslands of the wilderness become a lush pasture, and the hillsides blossom with joy. The meadows are clothed with flocks of sheep, and the valleys are carpeted with grain. They all shout and sing for joy!"
2. Psalm 126:6 (TPT): "They will return with joyful laughter and shouting with gladness as they bring back armloads of blessing and a harvest overflowing!"
3. Psalm 144:13 (TPT): "Our barns will be filled to the brim, overflowing with the fruits of our harvest."
4. "For it to manifest, you've got to believe it. You've got to switch over and believe what the Bible says—that's called faith! Faith is switching over from unbelief to belief." —Gloria Copeland
5. "If you don't say it, you haven't taken it. You continue to say it until it's manifest." —Gloria Copeland

B. Joel 2:22-24—Abundant Harvest Produce Maximum Results

1. AMPC: "Be not afraid, you wild beasts of the field, for the pastures of the wilderness have sprung up and are green; the tree bears its fruit, and the fig tree and the vine yield their [full] strength. Be glad then, you children of Zion, and rejoice in the Lord, your God; for He gives you the former or early rain in just measure and in righteousness, and He causes to come down for you the rain, the former rain and the latter rain, as before. And the [threshing] floors shall be full of grain and the vats shall overflow with juice [of the grape] and oil."
 - a. Verse 22 (MSG): "The trees are bearing fruit again: a bumper crop of fig trees and vines!"
2. Zechariah 8:12 (NIV): "The seed will grow well, the vine will yield its fruit, the ground will produce its crops, and the heavens will drop their dew. I will give all these things as an inheritance to the remnant of this people."
 - a. Verse 12 (MSG): "Gardens will flourish."
3. Amos 9:13 (NLT): "'The time will come,' says the Lord, 'when the grain and grapes will grow faster than they can be harvested.'"





C. Proverbs 3:9-10—Tithing Is Key to Overflowing Harvests

1. NIV: “Honor the Lord with your wealth, with the firstfruits of all your crops; then your barns will be filled to overflowing, and your vats will brim over with new wine.”
2. MSG: “Honor God with everything you own; give him the first and the best. Your barns will burst, your wine vats will brim over.”
3. Malachi 3:11 (NIV): “‘I will prevent pests from devouring your crops, and the vines in your fields will not drop their fruit before it is ripe,’ says the Lord Almighty.”

DAY 3—Supernatural Harvests

A. Genesis 26:1, 12-14—Supernatural Harvests in Spite of Famine

1. Verse 1—There was a famine in the land.
 - a. Serious economic downturn
 - b. Severe shortage
 - c. Extreme scarcity
2. Verses 12-14: “Then Isaac sowed in that land, and received in the same year an hundredfold: and the Lord blessed him. And the man waxed great, and went forward, and grew until he became very great: For he had possession of flocks, and possession of herds, and great store of servants: and the Philistines envied him.”
 - a. The normal yield in Gerar was less than 25-fold.
 - b. Isaac reaped a hundredfold in the same year!
 - c. He didn’t eat his seed.
3. “You’ve always got a seed if you’ll just think about it. Do something for somebody.” —Gloria Copeland
4. Verses 12-13 (MSG): “Isaac planted crops in that land and took in a huge harvest. God blessed him. The man got richer and richer by the day until he was very wealthy.”
 - a. In times of famine, we don’t just survive—we thrive!
 - b. Psalm 37:18-19 (NLT): “Even in famine they will have more than enough.”
 - c. Hebrew = He will supply until no more is needed.
5. “Don’t ever be jealous of another’s man harvest if you want a harvest yourself.” —Gloria Copeland

B. Jeremiah 17:5-8—Supernatural Harvest in Spite of Economic Conditions

1. NLT: “Cursed are those who put their trust in mere humans, who rely on human strength and turn their hearts away from the Lord. They are like stunted shrubs in the desert, with no hope for the future. They will live in the barren wilderness, in an uninhabited salty land. But blessed are those who trust in the Lord and have made the Lord their hope and confidence. They are like trees planted along a riverbank, with roots that reach deep into the water. Such trees are not bothered by the heat or worried by long months of drought. Their leaves stay green, and they never stop producing fruit.”





2. Verses 7-8 (NIV-84): "Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord, whose confidence is in him. He will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."
3. Verse 8 (MSG): "Never a worry through the hottest of summers, never dropping a leaf, serene and calm through droughts, bearing fresh fruit every season."

C. John 6:11-13—Immediate Harvests

1. NIV: "Jesus then took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted. He did the same with the fish. When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, "Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted." So they gathered them and filled twelve baskets with the pieces of the five barley loaves left over by those who had eaten."
2. "I had made plans to attend one of Brother Copeland's meetings. At that time, I needed a \$10,000 miracle for a particular need. I almost didn't attend but I knew I needed to be there. I decided to bring my \$1,000 seed to the meeting to sow toward a harvest of \$10,000. Before the seed was in the ground, the \$10,000 showed up!"
3. Amos 9:13 (NLT): "'The time will come,' says the Lord, 'when the grain and grapes will grow faster than they can be harvested.'"

DAY 4—Extreme Harvests

A. Leviticus 26:3-5, 9-10—An Extreme Surplus of Crops

1. Verses 3-5, 9 (TLB): “If you obey all of my commandments, I will give you regular rains, and the land will yield bumper crops, and the trees will be loaded with fruit long after the normal time! And grapes will still be ripening when sowing time comes again. You shall eat your fill, and live safely in the land.... I will look after you, and multiply you, and fulfill my covenant with you.”
2. We are not limited to one big harvest a year.
3. “Our supernatural Word crop can be sown and reaped at any time.” —Gloria Copeland
4. Verse 10 (NLT): “You will have such a surplus of crops that you will need to clear out the old grain to make room for the new harvest!”
5. Verse 10 (NIV): “You will still be eating last year’s harvest when you will have to move it out to make room for the new.”

B. Numbers 13:23—Extremely Large Produce

1. NLT: “When they came to the valley of Eshcol, they cut down a branch with a single cluster of grapes so large that it took two of them to carry it on a pole between them! They also brought back samples of the pomegranates and figs.”
2. Exactly how large was this cluster?
 - a. According to the Guinness Book of World Records, the largest modern cluster of grapes was grown by a man in Chile and weighed a little less than 21 pounds.
 - b. It does not take two men to carry 21 pounds.
 - c. The cluster must have been extremely heavy.
3. Commentary from the *Chumash*, pages 944-945:
 - a. Verse 23: “They came to the Valley of Eshkol and they cut a branch with a cluster of grapes and they carried it on (two) double poles.”
 - b. Rashi writes, “Eight of them took the bunch of grapes, one took a fig and one took a pomegranate.”

C. Leviticus 25:21-22—The Abundant Harvest Blessing Is Upon Us!

1. Because THE BLESSING is upon us, we will reap record-breaking, award-winning, extreme bumper-crop harvests.
2. Leviticus 25:21-22 (ESV): “I will command my blessing on you in the sixth year, so that it will produce a crop sufficient for three years. When you sow in the eighth year, you will be eating some of the old crop; you shall eat the old until the ninth year, when its crop arrives.”



3. Verses 21-22 (MSG): “I assure you, I will send such a blessing in the sixth year that the land will yield enough for three years. While you plant in the eighth year, you will eat from the old crop and continue until the harvest of the ninth year comes in.”
4. Genesis 41:46-49 (MSG): “Joseph was thirty years old when he went to work for Pharaoh the king of Egypt. As soon as Joseph left Pharaoh's presence, he began his work in Egypt. During the next seven years of plenty the land produced bumper crops. Joseph gathered up the food of the seven good years in Egypt and stored the food in cities. In each city he stockpiled surplus from the surrounding fields. Joseph collected so much grain—it was like the sand of the ocean!—that he finally quit keeping track.”
5. Verse 49 (NIV): “Joseph stored up huge quantities of grain, like the sand of the sea; it was so much that he stopped keeping records because it was beyond measure.”

There is an extreme, abundant harvest in every seed we sow!

DAY 5—How to Reap an Abundant Harvest

A. Mark 4:26-29—Reaping Is Our Responsibility

1. “So is the kingdom of God, as if a man should cast seed into the ground; and should sleep, and rise night and day, and the seed should spring and grow up, he knoweth not how. For the earth bringeth forth fruit of herself; first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear. But when the fruit is brought forth, immediately he puts in the sickle, because the harvest is come.”
2. Reaping is not automatic.
3. The harvest won't jump from the field to the barn by itself.
4. It would be wrong for a farmer to leave his harvest standing in the field.
 - a. Proverbs 10:5 (MSG): “Make hay while the sun shines—that's smart; go fishing during harvest—that's stupid.”
 - b. Just think about Pop's peaches.
 - c. “If you want to taste it, you have to harvest it.” —Gloria Copeland
 - d. “You pick it, you pack it, you ship it.” —Gloria Copeland
5. “If you haven't thought of yourself as a harvester before now, start thinking of yourself that way. Renew your mind to the truth of God's Word. Dare to believe the Lord of the harvest is calling you—yes, you—to help Him bring in His end-time crops. He is speaking to you and saying, ‘Until now, you've known Me as the Lord over your seed. You've known Me as your bread provider. But, I want you to know Me now as Lord and Minister of the harvest.’ — from *Get Your Mind on the Harvest* by Kenneth Copeland

B. Isaiah 41:15—We Reap With Words of Faith

1. “Behold, I will make thee a new sharp threshing instrument having teeth: thou shalt thresh the mountains, and beat them small, and shalt make the hills as chaff.”
2. *Having teeth* (HEB) = Mouths
3. When it talks about the farmer putting in the sickle, it's the *mouth*.
4. “When harvest time comes, you'd better call it in!” —Gloria Copeland
5. We reap the harvest the same way we acquire anything else—by our words of faith.
6. Your mouth is your harvesting instrument.
7. Send the harvesting angels to gather it up.

C. Psalm 67:5-6—Praise Is the Key to an Abundant Harvest

1. “Let the people praise thee, O God; let all the people praise thee. Then shall the earth yield her increase; and God, even our own God, shall bless us.”
2. “Once you sow the seed, you have to go from being seed-minded to harvest-minded.” —Dr. Oral Roberts





3. "Once you sow your seed, keep feeding it faith. Faith is the fertilizer." —Gloria Copeland
4. The depth of your praise will determine the magnitude of your harvest.
 - a. Praise gives voice to our faith in God's Word.
 - b. Praise is like Miracle-Gro® —it moves things along faster.
 - c. The more we praise, the bigger the harvest.
5. Galatians 6:9 (AMPC): "Let us not lose heart and grow weary and faint in acting nobly and doing right, for in due time and at the appointed season we shall reap (an abundant harvest), if we do not loosen and relax our courage and faint."
