

Dinnertime Devotion

– REALLY Big Faith –

Jenna's dad is a pastor at her church, and he has taught her a lot about having faith in God, even in scary situations. She knows that Psalm 91 promises that God will protect her, and she really, really believes it!

One day, when she was driving through Kansas in a van with her family and friends, a tornado dropped down and was spinning around really fast. It was miles ahead of them, but it seemed so close! As the wind got stronger and stronger, the people riding in the van ducked down away from the windows. She could tell they were concerned and afraid, but all she could think about was Psalm 91 and God's promise of protection.

What should Jenna do?

- A. Hide behind her friends and family, and let herself feel afraid.
- B. Have REALLY big faith, say, "I have Psalm 91 protection!" out loud, and refuse to be afraid. She should trust God, and ask Him to send His angels to protect her.
- C. Scream really loud, and scare everyone else.

The correct answer is B.

Sometimes, when everyone around you seems to be afraid of something, you might think you should be, too! But God tells us that we never have to be afraid. The devil wants you to feel afraid, but he's just trying to trick you. Spend some time reading Psalm 91 this week—even have a family challenge to memorize it! Then, always remember that you are protected, and you don't have to feel or act afraid ever again.

If you make the Lord your refuge, if you make the Most High your shelter, no evil will conquer you; no plague will come near your home. For he will order his angels to protect you wherever you go." –Psalm 91:5, 9-11
