There is a difference between
speaking *to* your mountain and
speaking *about* your mountain.

Speaking *about* your mountain will magnify the problem in your mind. The problem will begin to look bigger and bigger in your sight.

But speaking *to* your mountain keeps things in proper perspective.

When you put God's Word in your mouth, magnifying the answer above all else, speaking *to* the mountain will cause it to move.

Jesus said:

“For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall **say** unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

“Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them”
(Mark 11:23-24, *KJV*, emphasis mine).

As you step into the new year:

1. Take a day and keep track of how many times you speak *about* the problem you're facing.
2. Go to God's Word—the Bible—and find out what *it* says about the problem.
3. Begin to replace your words about the situation with God's Word on the matter.

Each time you start to speak *about* the problem, remind yourself to speak *to* it. Tell it to change and conform to what the Word says.

Then, watch that mountain move!
