



## 10 Days of Healing

### DAY I—Renewing Your Mind to Good Health

#### A. Romans 10:17—The Threefold Purpose of This Series

1. To receive our healing
  - a. We will see from Scripture that healing belongs to the believer. But it is received by faith. Faith is essential.
  - b. Mark 5:34—Your faith has made you whole.
  - c. James 5:15 (NKJV)—“The prayer of faith will save the sick.”
  - d. How do we get faith? That brings us to our second purpose.
2. To invest our time
  - a. Romans 10:17 (NKJV): “Faith [for healing] comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God” about healing.
    - i. It takes time to “hear and hear.”
    - ii. It takes focus. It can’t be treated lightly.
  - b. So we will have ten days of immersion in healing. You can extend it throughout the day to make it total immersion (like Brother Copeland did).
3. To renew our minds
  - a. Change our belief system concerning our health.
  - b. It is God’s desire for us to live in divine health.
  - c. “I want My people well.”
  - d. “My people are not the sick trying to get well. They are the healed and Satan is trying to steal their health from them.”
  - e. “Your healing is already an accomplished fact. Jesus paid the price for it, and healing belongs to you now.” —Kenneth E. Hagin

#### B. Romans 12:2—The Renewing of Our Minds

1. Romans 12:2: “And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God.”
  - a. AMPC: “Do not be conformed to this world (this age), [fashioned after and adapted to its external, superficial customs], but be transformed (changed) by the [entire] renewal of your mind [by its new ideals and its new attitude], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what is the good and acceptable and perfect will of God, even the thing which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His sight for you].”
2. Romans 8:5 (NKJV): “For those who live according to the flesh (are those who) set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit (or according to His will for you to be well, are those who set their minds on), the things of the Spirit.”



- a. To be minded like everyone else naturally is, is death. But to be minded like the Spirit is life and peace.
  - b. We must see things as God sees them and think of things as God thinks of them. He is NOT like the world.
3. Joshua 1:8 (NKJV): "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success."
4. 3 John 2 (NKJV): "Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers."
  - a. Your soul is your mind, will and emotions.
  - b. As your soul prospers, your body will be transformed and changed according to God's perfect will for you to be healed.

### C. Matthew 13:15-16—A Healing Conversion

1. Reach out for a new level of understanding and comprehension concerning the power of God to heal your body.
2. Verse 15: "For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes they have closed; lest at any time they should see [God's Word about healing] with their eyes and hear [God's Word about healing] with their ears, and should understand [God's Word about healing] with their heart, and should be converted [to God's Word about healing], and I should heal them."
3. *Convert* = completely change
4. Verse 16: "But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear."
5. "When you know that by His stripes you are healed, and you know that in your spirit just like you know that  $2 + 2 = 4$  in your mind, the devil won't have any authority over you. The way to know that in your spirit is by meditating upon it with your mind until it filters down into your spirit. Then, you will be certain and sure." —Kenneth E. Hagin

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### DAY 2—God's Will Is Healing

#### A. I John 5:14-15—The Importance of Knowing God's Word

1. "And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask anything according to his will, he heareth us: and if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him."
2. We must eliminate any uncertainty concerning God's will for us to be healed.
3. Faith for healing stops at the question mark.
4. Hebrews 4:16: "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need."
5. Concerning healing, we must no longer use the faith-destroying phrase, "If it be Thy will."
6. Faith for healing begins where the will of God is known.
7. God's Word is His will.
8. Numbers 23:19 (NKJV): "God is not a man, that He should lie, nor a son of man, that He should repent. Has He said, and will He not do? Or has He spoken, and will He not make it good?"

#### B. From *Christ the Healer* by F.F. Bosworth

Appropriating faith cannot go beyond one's knowledge of the revealed will of God.

Before attempting to exercise faith for healing, one needs to know what the Scriptures plainly teach, that it is just as much God's will to heal the body as it is to heal the soul.

It is only by knowing that God promises what you are seeking, that all uncertainty can be removed and a steadfast faith is made possible. His promises are each a revelation of what God is eager to do for us. Until we know what God's will is, there is nothing to base our faith on.

The first step toward being healed is the same as the first step toward salvation, or any other blessing that God promises; that is, for the sick person to know what the Bible clearly teaches, that it is God's will to heal until one has lived out the allotted span of life. Each individual sufferer must be convinced by the Word of God that his or her healing is the will of God; for it is impossible to have real faith for healing as long as there is the slightest doubt as to its being God's will.

It is impossible to boldly claim by faith a blessing which we are not certain that God offers, because the power of God can be claimed only where the will of God is known. For instance, it would be next to impossible to get a sinner to 'believe unto righteousness' before you had fully convinced him it was God's will to save him.

Faith begins where the will of God is known.



Faith must rest on the will of God alone, not on our desires or wishes.

Appropriating faith is not believing that God can—but that He will.

Those who claim to believe in healing but say one word in favor of it and ten words against it, cannot produce faith for healing.

When God commands us to pray for the sick, He means us to pray with faith, which we could not do if we did not know His will in the matter. Until a person knows God's will, they have no basis for faith, because faith is expecting God to do what we know is His will to do.

When we know it is His will, it is not difficult for us to believe that He will do what we are sure He wants to do. There can be no appropriation by faith until we know what God has provided for us.

### C. John 1:14—Jesus—God's Will on Earth

1. "And [Jesus] the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."
2. John 5:19 (NKJV): "The Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner."
3. Matthew 9:35: "And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people."
  - a. What did Jesus do? He would preach, teach, and heal.
  - b. Jesus, the Living Word brought the Spoken Word based on the Written Word.
  - c. The Word became flesh to the leper and eyes to the blind.
4. John 6:38 (NKJV): "For I came down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him that sent Me."
5. Luke 6:17-18 (NKJV): "He came...and a great multitude of people...came to hear Him and be healed of their diseases, as well as those who were tormented with unclean spirits. And they were healed."
  - a. Hearing the Word came first because faith comes by hearing the Word (Romans 10:17).
  - b. Their faith was activated, and they received their healing.
6. Matthew 12:14-15: "Then the Pharisees went out, and held a council against him, how they might destroy him. But when Jesus knew it, he withdrew himself from thence: and great multitudes followed him, and he healed them all."
7. Acts 10:34, 38: "Then Peter opened his mouth, and said, Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons...How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him."
8. Hebrews 1:3 (AMPC)—Jesus is "...the sole expression...of [God's] nature."
  - a. God is love (1 John 4:16).
  - b. It is His nature to heal.



9. Note John 12:50 (AMPC)—“Whatever I speak, I am saying [exactly] what My Father has told Me to say and in accordance with His instructions.”
10. Jesus never said, “It’s not My will” or “not the Father’s will to heal you.” He never said, “Keep your sickness. You need to learn something.”

#### D. James 1:2-8—Settle God’s Will

1. Verses 2-4: “My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.”
  - a. Not rejoicing because you’re sick! But because there is an answer. There’s help.
  - b. Notice twice the word, “work” is used. Faith will put patience to work. You let or put patience to work. Remain steadfast.
2. Verses 5-8: “If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. FOR LET NOT THAT MAN THINK THAT HE SHALL RECEIVE ANY THING OF THE LORD. A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.”
3. Verse 8 (AMPC): “[For being as he is] a man of two minds (hesitating, dubious, irresolute), [he is] unstable *and* unreliable *and* uncertain about everything [he thinks, feels, decides].”
4. Until the fact that it is God’s will for you to be healed is settled in your mind and spirit (heart), you cannot approach healing without being double minded and wavering.
5. Why Christians are sick:
  - a. A lack of knowledge of their Covenant right to be healed.
  - b. Incorrect knowledge
    - i. “God puts sickness on you to teach you.”
    - ii. “It may not be God’s will for you to be healed.”
  - c. Too weak to receive or too weak to hold on to their healing.
    - i. We must grow in the things of God.
    - ii. Side journey: This can be because of spiritual drains: sin, strife, disobedience, or fear.
    - iii. This includes watching others in sin and strife i.e. TV, movies, or the internet.
  - d. Proverbs 4:20-27 (AMPC): “My son, attend to my words; consent and submit to my sayings. Let them not depart from your sight; keep them in the center of your heart. For they are life to those who find them, healing and health to all their flesh. Keep and guard your heart with all vigilance and above all that you guard, for out of it flow the springs of life. Put away from you false and dishonest speech, and willful and contrary talk put far from you. Let your eyes look right on [with fixed purpose], and let your gaze be straight before you. Consider well the path of your feet, and let all your ways be established and ordered aright. Turn not aside to the right hand or to the left; remove your foot from evil.”



6. Hosea 4:6 (NIV): “My people are destroyed from lack of knowledge.”
7. Proverbs 29:18 (AMPC): “Where there is no vision [no redemptive revelation of God], the people perish; but he who keeps the law [of God, which includes that of man]—blessed (happy, fortunate, and enviable) is he.”

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### DAY 3—What Does He Will?

#### A. James 1:5-8—"I Will" Scriptures

1. "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. A double minded man is unstable in all his ways."
  - a. Verse 8 (AMPC): "[For being as he is] a man of two minds (hesitating, dubious, irresolute), [he is] unstable and unreliable and uncertain about everything [he thinks, feels, decides]."
  - b. Your mind is your mind. Bring your thoughts in line with what God says about you and your health.
2. Faith begins where the will of God is known.
3. You must settle that it is God's will for you to be well.
4. Exodus 15:26—"I WILL NOT put any diseases on you—for I AM the Lord that heals you."
  - a. This reveals His nature, His character.
  - b. God is our great I AM Who heals us.
5. Exodus 23:25 (NKJV)—"I WILL take sickness away from the midst of you."
  - a. For instance, "This pill will make that sickness go away."
  - b. That's how it works.
  - c. In the same way that the pill won't put the disease on you, God won't put sickness on you.
  - d. God is not of two opinions. His nature and character are to get you out from under sickness, disease, or poverty.
  - e. The pill will take it away and God will take it away.
  - f. God takes it away without the negative side effects!
6. Exodus 23:26 (NKJV)—"I WILL fulfill the number of your days."
  - a. Healing is always coming from Him.
  - b. Healing is not something He turns off and on.
7. Psalm 91:14-16—"I WILL deliver you."
  - a. The integrity of the Word is sure. When God says He will, He will.
  - b. We must choose to believe Him and what He says.
  - c. Look to the Lord and say, "Lord, I believe You. I believe You can. I believe You will. I believe You do."



## B. John 6:38—What About Jesus?

1. "For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me."
2. By nature and purpose, Jesus was and is an agent and the perfect expression of God's will.
  - a. Hebrews 1:3 (AMPC): "He is the sole expression of the glory of God...and He is the perfect imprint and very image of [God's] nature...."
3. *To will* = what one chooses, desires; a determined purpose to fulfill God's purpose.
  - a. "Thy will be done" (Matthew 6:10).
  - b. We must not confuse this with, "If it be Thy will."
  - c. When the Bible tells us what the will of God is, we have no right to argue or debate it.
  - d. "Not My will, but Yours, be done" (Luke 22:42, NKJV).
4. Jesus was the will of God in motion, on display.
5. Matthew 4:23-24—He went about healing every sickness.
6. Matthew 8:16—He healed all who were sick with His Word.
  - a. Psalm 107:20: "He sent His Word, and healed them, and delivered them from their destructions."
  - b. What He willed, He said and what He said, worked His will and the Spirit caused it to come to pass.
  - c. Psalm 89:34 "My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips."
  - d. God has provided all we need in Christ Jesus.
  - e. Our part is to believe Him and then to receive.
7. Acts 10:38: "How God anointed Jesus...who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with Him."
  - a. What is the anointing?
  - b. It is God poured out on you and me—His ability to do what flesh cannot do.
  - c. It is not just the power to do what He can do.
  - d. It is the power to be a carrier of who He is and what He wills.
  - e. Mark 16:18—We, as believers, "shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover."

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### DAY 4—But... *Will* He Heal?

#### A. Matthew 8:1-3—I Will—Be Thou Clean

1. "When he was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed him. And, behold, there came a leper and worshipped him, saying, Lord, if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. And Jesus put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed."
2. Leprosy was incurable at that time.
3. The leper knew Jesus could heal, but would He? Knowing God can is not enough.
4. "I will" was not a passive, "Sure—OK, I'll do that."
  - a. Not impulsiveness
  - b. Not acquiescence
5. "I will" revealed His character—not only "I choose to" but "I'm disposed to."
  - a. "I am glad to." "Of course I will."
  - b. "I would rather do this than anything else." "I delight in it."
6. The leprosy was no competition for Jesus' compassion.
7. "I will" was Jesus healing with great purpose, intention, deep desire and intense determination.

#### B. Matthew 8:5-13—Jesus' Word Is His Will

1. "And when Jesus was entered into Capernaum, there came unto him a centurion, beseeching him, and saying, Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, grievously tormented. And Jesus saith unto him, I will come and heal him. The centurion answered and said, Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof: but speak the word only, and my servant shall be healed. For I am a man under authority, having soldiers under me: and I say to this man, Go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant, Do this, and he doeth it. When Jesus heard it, he marvelled, and said to them that followed, Verily I say unto you, I have not found so great faith, no, not in Israel. And I say unto you, That many shall come from the east and west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, in the kingdom of heaven. But the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said unto the centurion, Go thy way; and as thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee. And his servant was healed in the selfsame hour."
2. What the centurion understood:
  - a. He understood authority.
  - b. "Speak the Word only, and I'll act on it."
  - c. Jesus' Word was His will.





- d. His Word would do whatever He would do.
3. Jesus most certainly would because He would only say what He willed or intended.
4. Romans 10:17 (NKJV): "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."
  - a. Faith comes as we hear the Word—the spoken Word, the preached Word.
  - b. We read the Word and grab hold of it inside.
  - c. Are you letting His Word speak to you?
5. This is believing.
  - a. God can do what He wills.
  - b. God wills His will.
  - c. God speaks only what He wills.
  - d. His Spirit is bound by the same design to empower His Word.
6. What He wills, He says. What He says works His will.
7. 1 Peter 2:24—By the stripes of Jesus, I was healed.
8. Psalm 107:20: "He sent his word, and healed them."

### C. Made in God's Image

1. You were made in His image. By His design, you were created to be like Him. This is developed by His will at work in you. What He wills, He says, and what He says, works His will. So, put that Word of His will in you in abundance—more abundant than there is sickness.
2. Then, when it is in you in abundance, it will come out of your mouth. It comes out because you believe it. When you believe the words that you say, then the words you say will work what you believe—just like God! And His Spirit will move to confirm that word that you said and what He said—and the signs will follow!!
3. Matthew 12:34 (NKJV): "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks."
4. "From the abundance of your heart, your mouth leaks." Gloria Copeland
5. Let God's will be done in your body as it is in heaven.

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### DAY 5—Redeemed From the Curse

#### A. Galatians 3:13-14—We Have Been Redeemed From the Curse

1. "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree: that the blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ; that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith."
2. *Redeemed* = purchased, ransomed, bought back and rescued
3. Adam "sold" himself and the world to Satan. With that came sin, sickness and death. He had to be bought back, but at a higher price: Jesus.
4. With Jesus came life. John 10:10 says it's life greater than death or anything death brings.
5. Sickness came as a result of Adam's fall.
6. We were hostages to sin and its effects.
7. Jesus paid the full price for us to be redeemed from sickness and disease.
8. When we accepted Jesus, we received spiritual regeneration.
9. Colossians 1:13 (NKJV): "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love."
10. The life of God that now reigns in our spirits is far greater than the death that reigned in Adam. When that life is allowed to flow into our bodies, sickness is removed.

#### B. Deuteronomy 28—The Law at Work

1. The Law tells us about the blessings and curses and what brings them.
2. Verses 1-2 (NKJV): "Now it shall come to pass, if you diligently obey the voice of the LORD your God, to observe carefully all His commandments which I command you today, that the LORD your God will set you high above all nations of the earth. And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, because you obey the voice of the LORD your God."
3. Verses 3-14 identify the blessings.
4. The Law announces and identifies the curses that Satan invited into this earth after man's fall. The curse is the result of sin and it is at work in the earth.
5. As believers, we have been redeemed and delivered from the curse of the Law by the blood of Jesus (Galatians 3:13).

#### C. Deuteronomy 28—Sickness and Disease in the Curse

1. There is a difference in permissive and causative verbs.
2. In Hebrew, these verses below are in the permissive sense.
3. God doesn't cause the curses; He allows them based on spiritual law.



- a. If you get out in the world, living and acting like the world, you will get the results of sin.
  - b. The cleansing work of the blood of Jesus has provided us a way out of sin so we can live in The BLESSING.
  - c. God gives us the right to choose.
  - d. If we press over into identification with the world, then the results of sin come.
  - e. When we press into our identification in Christ, The BLESSING comes.
4. The effects of a fallen world and the results of sin are at work.
5. We need to stay under the umbrella of The BLESSING of the Lord, walking in His ways and will, under His protection.
6. The world churns with sin, sickness and death, but we can live redeemed.
7. Let's look at some curses that we are redeemed from.
8. Verse 22 (NLT): "The Lord will strike you with wasting diseases, fever, and inflammation, with scorching heat and drought, and with blight and mildew. These disasters will pursue you until you die."
  - a. This includes environmental causes.
9. Verses 27-28 (NLT): "The Lord will afflict you with the boils of Egypt and with tumors, scurvy (vitamin deficiency), and the itch, from which you cannot be cured. The Lord will strike you with madness, blindness, and panic."
10. Verse 35 (NLT): "The Lord will cover your knees and legs with incurable boils. In fact, you will be covered from head to foot."
11. Verses 59-61 (NLT): "Then the Lord will overwhelm you and your children with indescribable plagues. These plagues will be intense and without relief (AMPC = plagues of long continuance), making you miserable and unbearably sick. He will afflict you with all the diseases of Egypt that you feared so much, and you will have no relief. The Lord will afflict you with every sickness and plague there is, even those not mentioned in this Book of Instruction, until you are destroyed."
  - a. Jesus is the Name above every name that can be named.
  - b. Philippians 2:9-10 (NKJV): "Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth."
12. Verse 65 (NLT): "There among those nations you will find no peace or place to rest. And the LORD will cause your heart to tremble, your eyesight to fail, and your soul to despair."
13. A very important point to highlight is that the blessing rested on those who would listen to the commands of the Lord and do them—with joy!
14. Our No. 1 commandment is to walk in love.
15. John 15:12 (NKJV): "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."—and this is repeated throughout the New Testament.



### D. Acts 20:28—We Belong to Him

1. AMPC: "He obtained (the church of God) for Himself, [buying it and saving it for Himself] with His own blood."
2. 1 Corinthians 6:19-20: "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."
3. 1 Peter 1:18-19: "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed (purchased, bought back, rescued) with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But (your spirit, soul and body were purchased) with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot."
4. We have been redeemed from every sickness and disease listed in the curse.
5. Isaiah 53:4-5 (NKJV): "Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement for our peace was upon Him, and by His stripes we are healed."

### E. A Confession of Healing

All sickness, including \_\_\_\_\_ is a curse of the Law,  
but Christ has redeemed me from the curse of \_\_\_\_\_.  
Sickness and disease of all kinds are under the curse of the Law.  
But I am not under the curse.  
I walk in love, forgiving everyone.  
So, sickness, you have no right in my body.  
Leave me now.  
I receive the blessing of healing.  
I take it. It's mine.  
Thank You, Jesus.

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
