DAY 1 – BE STRONG IN FAITH LIKE GOD

Abraham is an example of being strong in faith toward God. As part of the covenant, God changed Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah. In the year 2024, we are going to live knowing God's character through His Names.

STUDY IT

- I. Abraham is an example of being strong in faith toward God.
 - Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him for righteousness (Romans 4:3).
 - Abraham was circumcised as a sign and a seal of the righteousness of faith (Romans 4:11).
 - God promised Abraham that he should be the heir of the world, through the righteousness of faith (Romans 4:13).
 - God established the Law and the prophets to teach people how to live righteously before Him.
 - Where there is no law, there is no transgression (Romans 4:15).
 - The Law began with the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:2-17).
 - The rich young ruler who came to Jesus couldn't keep the first commandment: "You shall have no other gods before Me" (Exodus 20:1-3). His god was his wealth, so he turned around and left (Luke 18:18-23).
- II. God made covenant with Abraham and promised to give him and his descendants the land where he was living (Romans 4:18).
 - "Therefore it is of faith, that it might be by grace; to the end the promise might be sure to all the seed" (Romans 4:16).
 - God also promised to make Abraham a father of many nations—beginning with having a son.
 - God was able to give life to Abraham's and Sarah's bodies so they could have a child.
 - "(As it is written, I have made thee a father of many nations,) before Him whom he believed, even God, who quickeneth the dead, and calleth those things which be not as though they were. Who against hope believed in hope,



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that he might become the father of many nations, according to that which was spoken, So shall thy seed be. And being not weak in faith, he considered not his own body now dead, when he was about an hundred years old, neither yet the deadness of Sarah's womb: He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God; and being fully persuaded that, what He had promised, He was able also to perform. And therefore it was imputed to him for righteousness" (Romans 4:17-22).

- It's difficult, but possible, for Christian people to call things they don't see as though they are visible.
- III. As part of the covenant, God changed Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah (Genesis 17:5, 15).
- God promised Sarah would have a son named Isaac.
 - God said He would BLESS Ishmael, but His covenant would be with Isaac (Genesis 17:19).
 - That's one of the original family feuds in history. Ishmael's mother, Hagar, was an Egyptian maid. She saw to it that Ishmael had an Egyptian wife, and out of that came another religion.
 - The same day God made covenant with Abraham, he, Ishmael and all males born in his house were circumcised. Abraham was 99 years old (Genesis 17:23-24).
- IV. In the year 2024, we are going to live knowing God's character through His Names.
- God's Names portray His identity.
 - I AM *El Shaddai*, The LORD Jehovah God, Almighty God, more than enough. I AM *Jehovah Rapha*, your Healer. I AM *Jehovah Rohi*, your Shepherd and you shall want nothing. I AM *Jehovah Jireh*, I am the Provider; *Jehovah Tsidkenu*, our Righteousness; *Jehovah Shalom*, our Peace, nothing missing, nothing broken. *Jehovah Nissi*, The LORD our Flag, our Banner.

MAKE IT PERSONAL

Faith comes by hearing The WORD of God. Pray with us that your faith will increase.

Heavenly Father, I ask You to help me as I hear Your WORD to allow my faith to grow. I want to walk in the faith of God so that I can speak to problems and they will disappear. I believe You will do this. Thank You. In Jesus' Name. Amen.



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DAY 2 – YOU HAVE GOD’S FAITH—BE LIKE HIM!

God gave Brother Copeland the revelation of the phrase, “Jesus Is LORD.” Through the sacrifice of Jesus, we have been justified. Jesus listed the commandments for the rich young ruler to obtain eternal life. In 2024, we are going to walk by faith and not by sight.

STUDY IT

- I. God gave Brother Copeland the revelation of the phrase, “Jesus Is LORD.”
 - “No one can [really] say, Jesus is [my] Lord, except by and under the power and influence of the Holy Spirit” (1 Corinthians 12:3, *Amplified Bible, Classic Edition*).
 - Brother Copeland was in Hereford, Texas, preaching a three-week meeting. He had his outlines laid out, and he asked The LORD which outline to use to begin the meeting.
 - The LORD asked him in his spirit, *Is there victory in the new birth? Is there victory in the Baptism in My Spirit? Every believer has a voice, and it is a voice of victory.*
 - Each believer is part of the Body of Christ.
 - “If the foot shall say, Because I am not the hand, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body? And if the ear shall say, Because I am not the eye, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body?” (1 Corinthians 12:15-16).
 - The Spirit of God is explaining that He cannot do anything in this earth without us.
 - Jesus said, “Ask and you shall receive, knock and it shall be opened unto you, seek and you shall find” (Matthew 7:7-8). Be sure to ask in faith.
- II. Through the sacrifice of Jesus, we have been justified.
 - “The just shall live by faith” (Galatians 3:11).
 - “Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us” (Galatians 3:13).
 - THE BLESSING started in the Garden of Eden. God BLESSED the man and the woman (Genesis 1:28).
 - God has offered THE BLESSING to believers through Jesus Christ, even those who were Gentiles, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith (Galatians 3:14).



- “And if ye be Christ's, then are ye Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise” (Galatians 3:29).
 - Faith works by Love (Galatians 5:6).
- III. Jesus listed the commandments for the rich young ruler to obtain eternal life (Mark 10:19).
- Jesus didn't list the first commandment, “Thou shalt have no other gods before Me” (Exodus 20:3).
 - Jesus loved him and said, “One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow Me” (Mark 10:21).
 - “He was sad at that saying, and went away grieved: for he had great possessions” (Mark 10:22). His money had possession of him. He left.
 - Then Jesus went ahead and answered the question of how to obtain eternal life: “Have faith in God” (Mark 11:22).
 - It's God's faith. Fear tolerated is faith contaminated.
- IV. In 2024, we are going to walk by faith and not by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7).
- “Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new” (2 Corinthians 5:17).
 - We have been given the ministry of reconciliation. We are ambassadors for Christ (2 Corinthians 5:19-20).
 - We have been made righteous. God had the authority to do it.
 - “For He has made Him to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him” (2 Corinthians 5:21).

MAKE IT PERSONAL

You have to choose to be like God and use His faith. It's a choice you must make. Begin studying the ways of God. Let Him put His plans in your heart and mind, then do them!

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DAY 3 – PRAY FOR LOVED ONES TO BE SAVED

Jesus' words have power. Here are examples of laborers sent across people's paths to bring them to Jesus: A woman asked Brother Copeland to go see her dad in a nursing home. A pastor's belief system changed when he heard Brother Copeland preach.

STUDY IT

- I. Jesus' words have power.
 - Jesus entered Jerusalem riding on the back of a colt (Mark 11:7).
 - This donkey colt that no one had ever ridden didn't buck or kick when Jesus sat on his back. The Spirit of God tamed that colt.
 - This was to fulfill prophecy (Zechariah 9:9).
 - When Jesus went into the Temple, He didn't say anything, He just looked around.
 - The next day, Jesus was hungry. He saw a fig tree having leaves, so he approached it looking for fruit, but he found nothing but leaves.
 - A footnote in the *Amplified Bible, Classic Edition* says that the leaves and the fruit appear on a fig tree at the same time; but on this tree, there were no figs.
 - He said, "No man eat fruit of thee hereafter for ever" (Mark 11:14).
 - Jesus went on into Jerusalem, He cast out those who sold and bought in the Temple.
 - The following day, the disciples called attention to the fig tree dried up from the roots.
 - Jesus explained, "Have faith in God" (Mark 11:22).
 - "The just shall live by faith" (Hebrews 10:38).
 - "Now faith is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things [we] do not see and the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses]" (Hebrews 11:1, *AMPC*).
- II. Here are examples of laborers sent across people's paths to bring them to Jesus.
 - A young man said to Brother Copeland, "My older brother walks away whenever I talk to him about God."



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- They prayed and agreed for God to send laborers across his brother's path with the message of salvation and being baptized in the Holy Ghost based on Matthew 18:19-20.
 - A few days later his brother called him and asked, "What did you do?"
 - The brother had picked up a hitchhiker who had a Bible. The hitchhiker started talking to the brother about Jesus, and he couldn't get those words off of his mind.
 - Finally, the brother fell on his knees, received Jesus as his Savior and LORD and was baptized in the Holy Spirit.
- III. A woman asked Brother Copeland to go see her dad in a nursing home.
- She asked Kenneth to pray for him.
 - Brother Copeland went and read to him. "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth The LORD Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation" (Romans 10:9-10).
 - The man told his daughter later, "I thought about what that preacher said, and I don't think I've ever done that."
 - He got down on his knees and received Jesus and was baptized in the Holy Spirit.
- IV. A pastor's belief system changed when he heard Brother Copeland preach.
- That pastor didn't believe in the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, speaking in tongues or that Jesus went to hell.
 - He walked up to Kenneth to rebuke him and his preaching.
 - Every time the man opened his mouth to speak, the words came out in tongues.
 - That night, he couldn't sleep, and he went to his church to pray.
 - The pastor asked Jesus, "Did You go to hell?" Jesus said, *You'd better believe it, big boy. If I hadn't, you would have.*

MAKE IT PERSONAL

Pray with us for your loved ones to be saved based on John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

Father, we know it's Your will that our loved ones be saved according to John 3:16. We ask You to send laborers to lead them to receive Jesus as LORD. Thank You, Sir. In Jesus' Name. Amen.



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DAY 4 – TAKE YOUR STAND OF FAITH

Take your stand of faith. There should not be any sick among you. Ask in faith and you will receive. The prayer of faith shall save him that is sick (James 5:15).

STUDY IT

- I. Take your stand of faith.
 - “Put on God’s complete armor, that you may be able to resist and stand your ground on the evil day [of danger], and, having done all [the crisis demands], to stand [firmly in your place]. Stand therefore [hold your ground]” (Ephesians 6:13-14, *AMPC*).
 - “Pray at all times... in the Spirit, with all [manner of] prayer” (Ephesians 6:18, *AMPC*).
 - Prayer does not make faith work; faith makes prayer work.
 - Apply faith to all types of prayer.
 - In *The New Testament in Modern Speech* (the Weymouth translation), Paul talks about praying in tongues. In that translation, instead of using the words “praying mysteries,” it says, “divine secrets” (1 Corinthians 14:2).
 - That translation also says faith needs “corresponding actions” instead of the word “works” (James 2:18).
- II. There should not be any sick among you.
 - Faith in the Name of Jesus shall save the sick, and The LORD shall raise him up (James 5:15).
 - “The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much” (James 5:16).
 - Have faith in the Name of The LORD.
 - Peter told the crowd that the crippled man was healed through the Name of Jesus and faith in His Name (Acts 3:16).
 - That miracle did not cause faith in the crowd, it was a sign and a wonder.
 - Faith in the Name of Jesus gave him perfect soundness.
 - You must ask in faith—faith in the Name, faith in the power of the Name.



- Faith in the Name is what made that man strong, not because Peter and John walked with Jesus or were apostles, not their holiness, but faith in the Name. Jesus told them this over and over again.

III. Ask in faith and you will receive.

- At the last Passover meal, Jesus said, "If ye abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you" (John 15:7).
 - "Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in My Name, He will give it you" (John 16:23)
- Jesus said, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is expedient for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send Him unto you" (John 16:7).
 - But when He comes, He won't speak of Himself (John 16:13).
- "All things that the Father hath are Mine: therefore said I, that He shall take of Mine, and shall show it unto you" (John 16:15).
- "Whatever you ask [demand] in My Name, I'll do it" (John 14:14).
 - "Hitherto have ye asked nothing in My Name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full" (John 16:24).

IV. The prayer of faith shall *save* him that is sick (James 5:15).

- *Save* is the same word that can be translated *healed, soundness, salvation, healing* and *deliverance*.
 - "The earnest (heartfelt, continued) prayer of a righteous man makes tremendous power available [dynamic in its working]" (James 5:16, *AMPC*).
- We are saved by grace through faith (Ephesians 2:8).
 - Have faith in God (Mark 11:22).
- The moment we believed what God said, faith came, and we were made new creatures.
- That is the faith of God: faith in The WORD, faith in the blood, and faith in His faith that lives in you. It comes by hearing The WORD. It is His faith working in you.

MAKE IT PERSONAL

Take your stand of faith as you pray. God promised to hear and answer your faith.

Write down what you believe God will do for you. Use words that prove that it's already done! For example: I believe my body is healed now, in Jesus' Name.



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DAY 5 – PRAY IN AGREEMENT WITH THE WORD

The prayer of agreement is the most versatile prayer. You have to deal with strife and settle whatever applies to your prayer situation. Have faith in God constantly.

STUDY IT

- I. The prayer of agreement is the most versatile prayer.
 - Use the prayer of agreement in the prayer of petition and the prayer of faith.
 - The greatest in the kingdom of God is whoever shall humble himself as a little child, be pliable in the hand of God, and be totally, absolutely dependent on Him (Matthew 18:4).
 - A little child isn't aware of problems that are tough to remove.
 - For adults, some habits or thoughts contrary to the things of God are so difficult to remove, it's almost like having to cut off a hand to get rid of them.
 - In heaven, the angels of these little ones always behold the face of the Father.
 - Your angel was assigned to you the moment your spirit was released into this atmosphere.
 - Jesus said, "Don't hinder these little ones."
 - We should be looking at the things Jesus said through His eyes.
- II. You have to deal with strife and settle whatever applies to your prayer situation.
 - Get the strife-spirit out of your prayer business.
 - Jesus is in our midst to carry out the agreement (Matthew 18:20).
 - We know Jesus is here because He always enters into the praises of His people.
 - There's a troop of angels ready to carry out agreement prayers.
 - Jesus said we must forgive up to 70 times seven. He is addressing unforgiveness (Matthew 18:21-22).
 - Strife was the major problem among Jesus' staff members.
 - It was evident when the disciples couldn't cast out the demon from a man's son. They could have cast it out; they'd been given the power to do it.



- Jesus corrected them in private. He talked to them about their disagreement of who was the greatest.
- It's all about harmony.

III. Have faith in God constantly.

- It's all about the heavenly grant.
- Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that it is granted to you, and you will get it (Mark 11:22-25, *AMPC*).
- Brother Copeland and Gloria needed \$5,000 for the ministry. They agreed with the agreement scriptures.
 - They wrote a heavenly grant, and that \$5,000 came quickly.
 - They learned that heaven would grant it to them if they had faith constantly and consistently, forgave, and stayed in agreement.

MAKE IT PERSONAL
